- +Kneeling. You are free to kneel or to stand as you receive the Sacrament.
- +<u>The common cup</u> is offered to all communicants along with individual cups. The pouring chalice will follow the common cup. If you have an individual cup in your hand, pastor/assistants with the common cup will know to bypass you with the common cup.
